

Title and Registration Requirements for a New Missouri Resident

This document provides new Missouri residents with the instructions, forms, and requirements to comply with Missouri law when applying for Missouri title and registration (i.e., license plates) for a vehicle.

NOTE: You have 30 days from the date of becoming a Missouri resident to title your vehicle.

NOTE: If your lienholder is currently in possession of your out-of-state title, please complete the owner and vehicle/unit information sections of the *Owner Out-of-State Title Request* (Form 5834). Mail, email, or fax the completed form to your lienholder to request the original out-of-state title. If the lienholder is unable to release the out-of-state title to you, the lienholder may complete and notarize the bottom section of the form and return the completed form along with acceptable proof of ownership documents (as outlined below) to you. Once you have received the out-of-state title or acceptable proof of ownership documents, you may apply for Missouri title and registration. A Missouri vehicle registration cannot be renewed until a Missouri certificate of title has been issued in your name.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- A completed *Application for Missouri Title and License* (Form 108), signed by the vehicle owner, *if applying by mail.*
- ☐ The current ownership document:
 - The original out-of-state title or ownership document; or
 - A written statement from your lienholder refusing to release the out-of-state title directly to you—on letterhead or using

the Owner - Out-of-State Title Request (Form 5834)—plus one of the following:

- A copy of the front and back of your out-of-state title held by your lienholder indicating your name as the owner and your lienholder's name as the lienholder; or
- An out-of-state title receipt indicating your name as the owner and your lienholder's name as the lienholder (when the out-of-state title is from an electronic titling state); or
- A statement from your lienholder declaring the out-ofstate title is held by an electronic titling state.
- A statement from your lienholder, on letterhead, declaring the out-of-state title is held by an electric titling state.

- A Vehicle Identification Number and Odometer Inspection (ID/OD) completed by an authorized Missouri inspection station (a copy is not acceptable). A Missouri safety inspection will satisfy this requirement.
 - If you and the vehicle are out of state at the time of titling, you may submit:
 - A notarized General Affidavit (Form 768), signed by you, explaining the reason you are unable to return to Missouri; and
 - A vehicle inspection performed by an authorized inspection station or law enforcement officer in the state where the vehicle is located.
 - If you are in the military and you and the vehicle are located out of state, you may submit a signed statement from a commissioned officer of the United States Armed Forces

You have two options to apply for your initial Missouri title and registration:

- In person at any Missouri license office; or
- By mail at the following address (please allow additional time for processing):

There are <u>additional processing options</u> when *renewing* a Missouri vehicle registration. Missouri license plates may be renewed up to six months before expiration and must be renewed by the last day of the expiration month.
