

THE STREETS OF WEST PRYOR COMMUNITY IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT

BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2024 BUDGET MESSAGE

The Streets of West Pryor Community Improvement District (the "District") was formed as a political subdivision of the State of Missouri, by the City Council of the City of Lee's Summit, Missouri (the "City") by Ordinance No. 8541, adopted on January 8, 2019. The City, the District and Streets of West Pryor, LLC (the "Developer") entered into a Cooperative Agreement dated March 25, 2019, (the "Cooperative Agreement") pursuant to which the District agreed to undertake the "CID Improvements" (as defined in the Cooperative Agreement). Developer and City also entered into that certain Tax Increment Financing Contract dated as of January 8, 2019, (the "TIF Contract").

The District adopted a fiscal year beginning July 1 and ending June 30 of each year, the same as the fiscal year for the City.

The District's sole source of revenue (the "District Revenues") consists of a one percent (1%) sales tax imposed on sales within the District. An election to consider whether to approve the District's one percent (1%) sales tax occurred on May 14, 2019, at which time qualified voters within the District voted to approve the District's one percent (1%) sales tax. The District's one percent (1%) sales tax was imposed on October 1, 2019.

The District's initial primary purpose is to assist in funding the costs associated with the CID Improvements and to pay the District's formation costs and administrative costs as contemplated by the Cooperative Agreement and TIF Contract. The District's budget for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 contemplates that \$221,000 of "Uncaptured District Revenues" (as that term is defined in the Cooperative Agreement) will be received prior to the end of the fiscal year.

The Cooperative Agreement contemplates that "District Obligations" (as defined in the Cooperative Agreement) that are paid with District Revenues may be issued with the approval of the District and the City, the proceeds of which will be used for the purpose of funding all, or an appropriate portion of, the "CID Improvement Costs" (as defined in the Cooperative Agreement). District Obligations have not yet been issued.

BUDGET SUMMARY

The District anticipates that the estimated revenues for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 from the uncaptured portion of the District's 1% sales tax and from sales tax income will total \$221,000, and that the District's proposed administrative expenditures during the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024 will total \$25,000. The estimated remaining proceeds of \$196,000 will be transferred to the Developer to reimburse for previously advanced costs.
